From the "Doc"

How do you become a camp director? Hmm. Every camp director probably has a different story. Mine may have begun in the summer of 1969 when I attended Camp Concordia with my friends from St. James Lutheran Church & School in Grand Rapids, Michigan (tepee picture). Or maybe it was because I loved outdoor activities (water skiing picture). But in the summer of 1980, I was able to serve at an LCMS camp in Wisconsin and my dream of being a leader of a Lutheran camp became real (picture with Randy in wheelchair). In 1981-82, I served my Director of Christian Education INTERNSHIP at that same camp and served with (my now wife) Mary for one summer.

Later, with the encouragement and support of my parents, I served 2 months as an interim director at another Wisconsin Lutheran camp, taught in an LCMS elementary school for 2 years, was married and then headed to southern California to serve as a youth director. Finally, in 1987, Mary and I had the opportunity to serve at the premier Lutheran camp in the LCMS - the Texas District's, Camp Lone Star and train under Garland Midgett (a master educator and leader in experiential education). God used that time to refine my leadership and programming skills as a year-round Program Coordinator (note: PCs were JUST becoming user friendly about then).

What did God do then? Mary and I begin our journey of being Called to serve LCMS camps that were either starting up or struggling to survive. After about a decade at a wilderness camp in Colorado, we both had the opportunity to serve as professors and staff at Concordia universities, landing back in camp ministry when our daughter was born. Today, we reflect back on being part of the growth of 4 LCMS camps in addition to Camp Concordia.

Over those years we have trained and led staff and campers in: climbing and rappelling on 200 foot rock faces, teaching outdoor education, running mountain bike camps, wilderness adventures, wild river canoe trips, singing around a campfire, launching model rockets, building climbing towers, hosting servant event groups from across the USA in projects from building bridges to serving the homeless, and it has been...an adventure!

And now you know how to become a camp director!

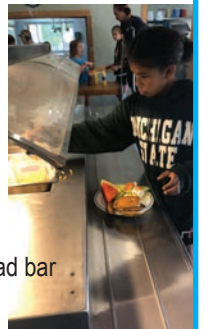

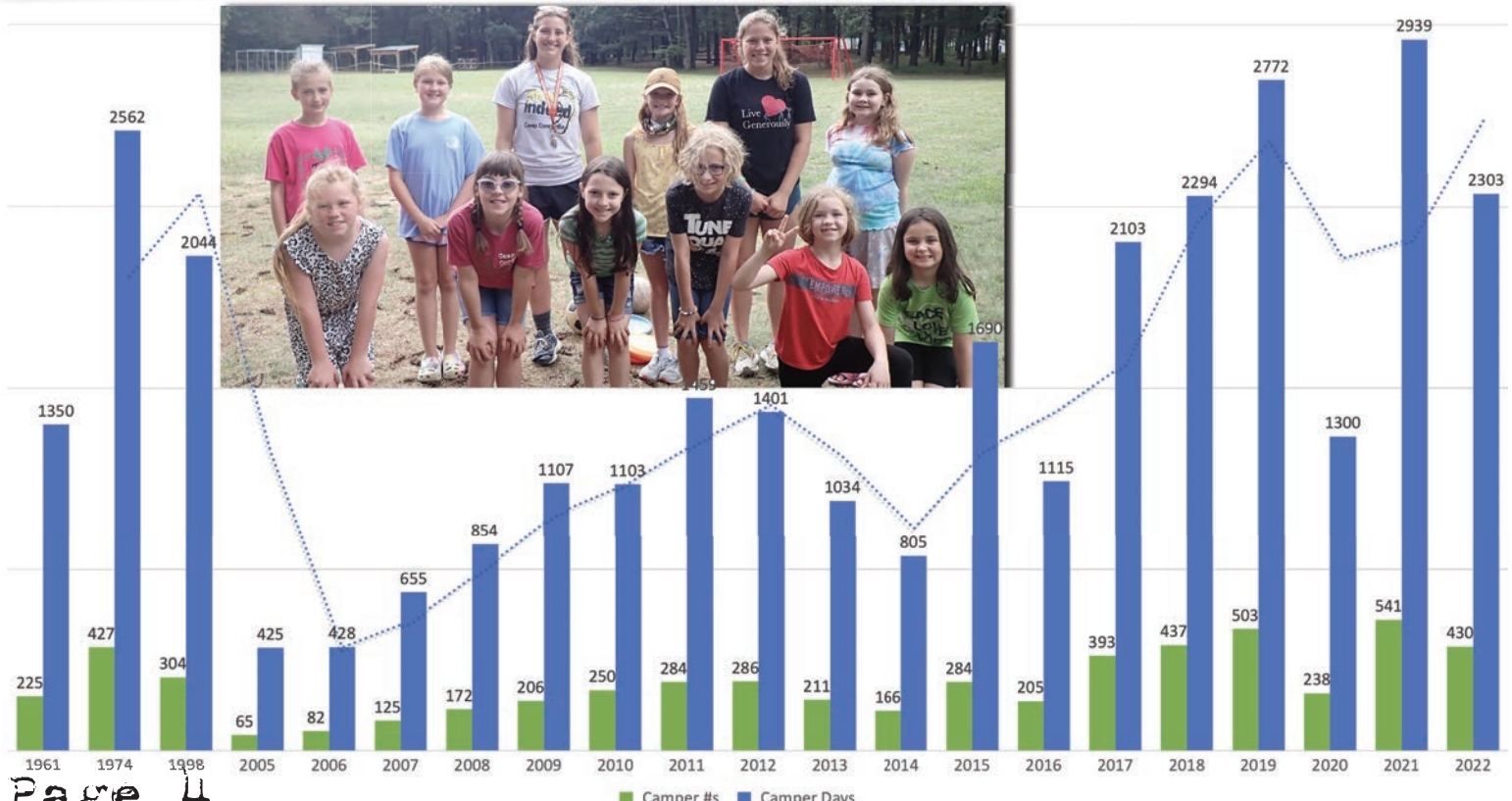
- In 2022, Camp Concordia received a **\$75,000 contribution** that is being designated for the new shower house.
- Staffing across the USA was difficult in 2022 and many camps closed their doors completely. Camp Concordia was blessed with 9 incredible staff, but that meant 120 campers had to be turned away. Two facts that are **noteworthy**: First, Camp Concordia increased pay to those dedicated staff that far supersedes what most residential overnight camps pay - this is reflected in Staff Salaries; second, Summer Camp income was significantly down.
- Therefore, note that in 2022, with the **significant rise in other costs**, the \$75,000 contribution was part of keeping camp in the black (would have been in the red by around \$4,000).
- A significant **decrease in program costs** in 2022 were due to not being able to run (and pay for) horse trail rides due to the staff shortage.

- Look at Utilities. Summer camp numbers have increased over 3 fold since 2014 and with creative efforts on the part of staff, **utilities** have stayed about the **same**.
- In 2014, a summer staff was paid \$180 per week. In 2022, summer ministry staff are making around \$400 per week depending on roles.

The Power of the Tower

Our goal is for the Camp Concordia climbing tower to be ready for the 2023 summer camp. With beginner, intermediate and advanced sides, campers will not only climb but learn the essential safety techniques prior to moving to the next level. This will include knots for climbing, terminology, etc. so that we can help them be safe wherever they might climb in their future. While we are still evaluating a starting age for the tower, campers will NEVER be forced to climb. They will just need to meet measurable criteria to move from beginner to intermediate and intermediate to advanced. (Tower still incomplete.)

Summer Camp
